We believe that as temporary stewards of the lands on which we operate, it is important to build and maintain a respectful and sustainable relationship with Indigenous host communities. We seek to achieve this by adhering to Iluka's values of acting with Integrity, demonstrating Respect and taking Accountability.

We will:

- Seek to engage with host communities early
- Engage collaboratively with Indigenous peoples to identify opportunities for partnerships to protect and maintain cultural heritage values where our operations may have an impact
- Demonstrate respect in acknowledging some of the oldest living cultures in the world
- Provide transparency throughout our engagements at all times
- Encourage our Indigenous workforce to share their perspectives and insights
- Strive to create opportunities for Indigenous employment and business
- Collaborate with host communities in supporting the removal of barriers to self-determination
- Provide a culturally safe and supportive work environment for our Indigenous workforce
- Provide opportunity for our Iluka workforce to undertake cultural competency training
